## NASA Mission Lands In Redding

NASA scientists are spending time in Redding. For the next week and a half scientists will be at the Dieselhorst and Sundial bridges working on the Surface Water/Ocean Topography Mission. It will give scientists their first comprehensive view of the earth's fresh water bodies from space, and a much more detailed measurement of the ocean surface.

NASA scientist Ernesto Rodriguez says, "People usually think of NASA as putting people on the moon, looking at planets and so forth. But actually a lot of NASA is devoted to looking at the Earth and trying to impact society. And we hop we're doing our part for that."

These scientists hope to gather vital information about land and surface water, which will provide drinking water for Earth's inhabitants.
